January-June 2020

For most of us, 2020 has been a year of challenge, change, and increased stress but for many children in need, the situation has been dire. During public health emergencies like the current COVID-19 outbreak, vulnerable families are disproportionately impacted. Those living in poverty, parents who hold lower-wage jobs and those who face other serious life obstacles many times have no safety nets to cushion these trying times.

As an increasing number of families in our area struggle to keep their children safe and cared for, we are steadfastly committed to delivering an increasing number of diapers and other essential items to our city's most at-risk young children. In 2019, we celebrated delivering 1M items over the year. While we are proud of that growth, we know that we must do more during this critical time for so many Baltimore families who are facing bare shelves, pay cuts and other economic hardships.

The ShareBaby family- founders, staff, board, partners, donors and volunteers- have stepped up in major ways over the past six months and we are proud to report that we have delivered 1,591,057 diapers and other essentials in 2020 as of July 1 and are dedicating ourselves to reach 2M by the close of the year! We thank you for sharing the love and hope that we continue to earn your attention and action as we move forward in our work.

COVID-19 EMERGENCY RESPONSE

Emergency Distribution Efforts

- We created an Emergency Diaper Hub program which has enabled us to give diapers and supplies directly to families in need at four sites across the city.
- We added an Emergency Partner program to onboard new agencies serving families in need on a temporary basis.
- On March 17, we opened shopping to our active partner agencies once a month and increased the amount of diapers and supplies available to them. On June 16, we increased partner shopping to twice a month.
- A partnership with the Baltimore City Health Department enabled us to purchase over 500,000 diapers and receive over 500,000 masks to distribute to families in need.

Volunteer & Warehouse Changes

- In an effort to keep our staff and volunteers as safe as possible, from March 17- June 15, we closed the warehouse to all volunteers and drop offs and implemented modified staff hours at the warehouse.
- On June 16, we re-opened the warehouse to limited volunteer groups of between 5-9 people and re-started drop off hours every Tuesday from 9am-12pm. We have limited donations to 12 high-needs items and we require everyone in the warehouse to wear masks and gloves at all times. Staff work remotely and remain on modified warehouse hours as needed. In addition, we are implementing temperature checks for all staff, partners, and volunteers upon entering the warehouse.
